- The <u>3 year Automotive Technology Pathway</u> is designed for students to begin in 9th or 10th grade.
- 2. The **2 Year Business Pathway** is designed for students to start in 11th grade.
- 3. The **2 Year Computer Information Management (CIM) Pathway** is also designed for students to start in 11th grade.

Students may only select 1 pathway.



3 Year Automotive Technology Pathway

The Auto pathway is for students interested in pursuing a career or furthering their education in the Automotive field of study. Students in this pathway receive a combination of lectures and hands on practical experience with the latest equipment and technology. Students who complete this early college program will receive 19.5 college units transferable to a Cal State University and may continue their education in Automotive Technology at Saddleback College to earn their Associates Degree.

2 Year Business Pathway

Students pursuing the Business Pathway will gain exposure to many aspects of the business world. They will explore business communications, human relations, marketing and business law. This will allow students to determine an area of focus for continued education. Students who complete this pathway will receive 23.5 college credits transferable to a Cal State University (7.5 to a UC) and a Business Certificate of Achievement. They may chose to continue their education and obtain an Associates Degree form Saddleback College or transfer their credits to a 4-year university.

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2 Year Computer Information Management (CIM) Pathway

The CIM pathway is designed for students interested in Cybersecurity and information security management. Students will explore a wide range of security measures from Networks, to firewalls, to wireless routers and a whole lot more. Students will also be writing code and gain experience with different operating systems. Students who finish this pathway will earn 22.5 transferable college credits to a Cal State University (7.5 units to a UC) and will earn a Cybersecurity/Information Security Analyst Certificate of Achievement. Completion of this pathway will give your student options to enter the workforce or continue their education in computer information management.

- Save time and Money Courses can be taken during the student's school day and are free
- College Credit Guarantee Courses are college courses and credit is not dependent on colleges accepting AP scores. Students can:
- Make significant progress toward completing the CSU and UC General Education Pattern (IGETC).
- Earn credits toward an Associate in Arts Degree.
- Earn transferable college units.
- Being a College student in high school use Saddleback's tutorial, college library, labs, and other facilities and equipment.



Important To Know

- These classes start an official and permanent college transcript.
- Students in The CVHS and Saddleback College Running Start Early College Program
 are dual enrolled and will receive both high school and college credit. Grades will
 appear on both high school and college transcripts. Classes will be taken online or on
 our CVHS campus during the bell schedule.
- Due to FERPA Law, parents will not have access to their student's progress in these classes. Saddleback is bound by this law with no exceptions.
- Saddleback College has their own Canvas where they conduct class and communicate. These classes WILL NOT appear in your CVHS Canvas. Students should check their MySite and SBC Canvas regularly.
- All pathways are subject to change.
- Post-Secondary Plans: College programs have unique requirements and taking college courses in high school may not be as beneficial for some students as taking advanced placement courses.
